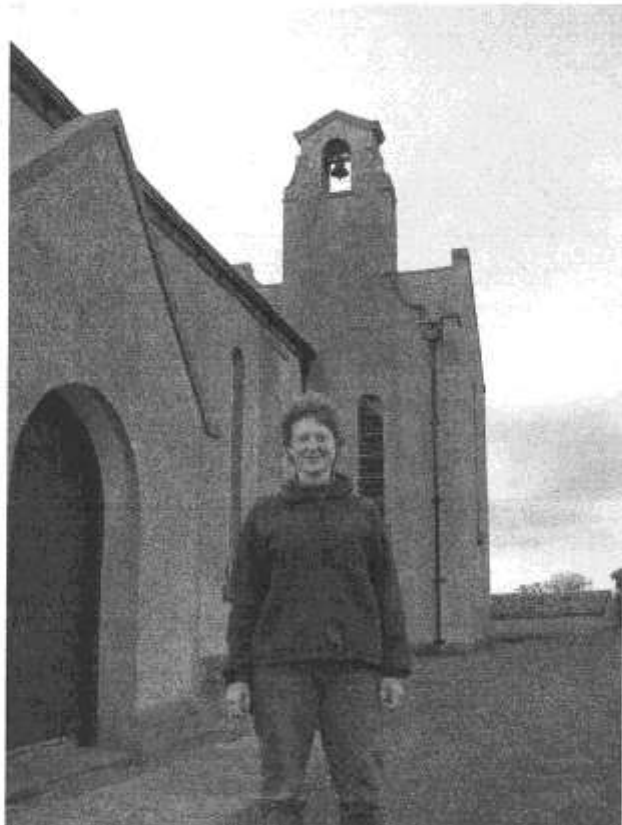

BRIGHT LIGHTS AMONG THE STARS

After their debut performance at the very successful school concerts on June 3rd & 4th the recently formed Stronsay School Music Group had their first 'overseas' performance on Tuesday 7th June. They were asked to take part in the 'Celebration of the Centennial' in St Magnus Cathedral. This was a service to celebrate 100 years since Norway's separation from Sweden.

The programme contained a rich variety of music with choral items from the Cathedral Choir, the Mayfield Singers and Emily Turton (Soprano), and instrumentals from Elizabeth Way Sullivan who played a Grieg Violin Sonata, and Traditional Norwegian music on accordions from Tommy Tulloch & Colin Cooper. There were three addresses - from the Norwegian Consul in London Tove Øvermo, from Ian MacLeod, Hon President of ONFA, and Stephen Hagan, Council Convener.

In the midst of this came our little music group and delighted the large audience with their playing a few well-known tunes (eg Norwegian waltz & Stronsay waltz). This group has only recently started playing together and they are a credit to the school. Many people came up to me afterwards to say how much they had enjoyed seeing and hearing them.

It began Sean & Elaine having accordion lessons and they soon roped in some of their friends who play the fiddle, and like ripples on a pond the group grew in size week by week as more youngsters wanted to join in. To date, including staff members, we have three accordions, five fiddles, two cellos, one guitar and one keyboard. Their enthusiasm is infectious, and now all we need are venues at which to play.

NEW LIFEGUARDS FOR STRONSAY

Stronsay swimming pool now has more lifeguards than ever before. In May three candidates from Stronsay passed their National Pool Lifeguard qualification. They were Andy Brown, Andrew Maxwell and Craig Weaver. Craig is only 16 and the youngest person ever to gain their 'Yellow shirt' on Stronsay. An NPLQ lifeguard is qualified to work in any swimming pool in Britain, even large leisure pools such as ones in Lerwick, Aberdeen and Inverness. There have been times in the past when our pool was short of lifeguards and opening times were restricted. These new lifeguards, plus others who qualified earlier for the 'Blue Shirt', should enable the pool to offer a better service to the public. A 'Blue Shirt' lifeguard has the same qualification as a swimming teacher plus extra first aid training. During public sessions, Stronsay Swimming pool always has a three person team on duty to ensure the highest standards of safety. They consist of a key holder, a yellow shirt lifeguard and another lifeguard who can be either a yellow or a blue shirt. Despite these satisfactory numbers, lifeguard training will continue on Stronsay. The lifeguards and key holders are aware of the contribution the pool makes to the facilities on Stronsay, especially for the children. They hope that the new generation of lifeguards will carry this forward into the future.

PAPA WESTRAY

One of the most remote islands in Orkney it only 4 miles long by 1 mile wide. It is home to the oldest house in northern Europe. 'Papay' as it is fondly known is famous for its bird life. A must to visit is the farm of Holland and its amazing complex of agricultural buildings. It is adjacent to Holland house which was the seat of the Traill Lairds of Papay for three centuries. Other places of interest are:- Bronze age landmarks - Knap of Howar, Fowl Craig and The old Pier. At the centre of the island is the only shop, run by the islands community co-operative.

**WHAT TO SEE,
WHERE TO GO****WESTRAY**

This is one of the most productive beef farming areas in Orkney. The fishing industry is built up around white fish trawlers and smaller craft fishing locally for crab and lobster. The rare corncrake with their characteristic call has occasionally been heard on summer evenings. Places to visit are Noltland Castle which is said to be linked by an underground passage to the Gentleman's Cave which was a place of refuge for Orkney Lairds who supported the 1745 Jacobite Uprising. The heritage centre is well worth a visit, local crafts and a cuppa are available. While you browse the genealogy section.- Noup Head cliffs and lighthouse - Holm of Farray and Rusk Holm an important breeding site for Grey Seals.

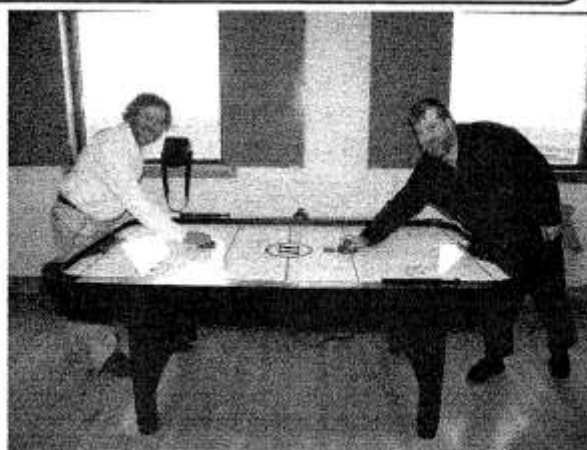
