RECENT BIRD SIGHTINGS

The hoped-for influx of Crossbills after the three birds at Osen last month did not arrive – but there is still time, and the warm SE winds predicted for the end of July may yet do the trick.

As ever there were very few surprises throughout late June and July but a pair of Siskins were seen in the hawthorn hedge opposite the Dale Quarry on 3rd July. Other migrants recorded were all waders – a single Bar-tailed Godwit at Houseby in late June – the same day as a Black-tailed Godwit was seen at the Matpow Loch, and 3 Bar-tails at Dale in mid-July. A party of 6 Dunlin has been present on the Matpow Loch for some time where the tern colony seems to have failed this year, just a single juvenile having been recorded among the 100 or so adults that have been in the area throughout the summer. A few Whimbrel have arrived from the North-East – including three flying in off Mill Bay and over Park Cottage on 24th.

Bird of the summer has been a female Montagu's Harrier, which we have seen at several sites. It is clearly smaller and 'lighter-looking' than Hen Harrier, with narrower wings and a longer and 'narrower' tail than that species. (It may still be around, one was recorded on Mainland Orkney in late Spring). Our last sighting was at Eastbank, where the bird's small size was evident as it perched on a fence-post close to the road. Unfortunately it was being 'mobbed' by a Hooded Crow and flew off towards Holland, showing the white patch on the rump which was smaller and less obvious than that of Hen Harrier.

More waders should arrive during the coming month, and many will be found feeding among the gulls and Starlings in the freshly-cut silage-fields – the biggest numbers being present during and immediately after both cutting and clearing. Among the local breeding species (Curlew and Oystercatchers in particular) Golden Plover and both species of godwit could be present. This is a great time for viewing these 'waders' as they seem almost oblivious to us humans during the feeding frenzy.

Luckily we had a taste of summer for our sheep shearing course. Well, perhaps the sheep might not have been too excited about this since the poor souls each had to endure a "slightly" longer shearing time due to us being absolute novices. But most of them were quite cooperative.

First day we got a theoretical introduction in the morning, enough to make us (me anyway!) a bit scared whether we would be able to use the machines without the sheep coming to harm.

Then it was hands on: this is really hard work! And it seems to be an art to know in which order you shear the different parts of the sheep.

After the first day most of us were absolutely exhausted and now I know how many muscles I have because I could feel every one of them.

On the second day we had spiritual assistance when three monks joined us. Luckily one of them (I hope he forgives me that I have forgotten his name) had some experience in shearing otherwise we would have never managed to get them all done that day. I must admit that I was glad we only had 4 machines so I could give my back some rest the second day.

Although some of us did really well (in particular Andy and Leah) the instructor could only award the wool board certificate to one participant, that's him in action:



We all still have a lot to learn to feel confident although I've seen some pretty impressive facebook images of Leah and Andy very successfully shearing their pet sheep at home shortly after the course.

A very big Thank You to the Stronsay Development Trust for funding this course and also to Don and Julie who allowed us to practise on their sheep and put up with all of us for 2 days.

It was a great experience!

STRONSAY DEVELOPMENT TRUST AGM ELECTIONS 2015

(personal view of attendee Leo Martini-Brown)

At the July 2015 AGM the Chair Carol Cotterill read out Article 84 which governs the procedure to be followed for a full member to be validly elected as an Elected Director of SDT. 3 of the candidates had provided some written biographical detail available at the AGM.

The two representatives from Voluntary Action Orkney (VAO) (non members of SDT) reported back to the Chair the results and commenced reading out the names of those elected, but without giving any vote. I objected and the Chair (wrongly in my opinion) allowed the members present to decide that they would only hear the number of "Yes" votes given to each candidate. Earlier in the AGM Valerie Stone-Lucas had protested that the Articles had not been amended and that the Chair had recognised that the use of "No" votes was not the Stronsay way. Some years ago I was the first to lose by the "No" exceeding the "Yes" by one vote in an SDT director secret count election.

Raymond Dennison (immediate past director) was re-elected top the poll again with 24 votes (down from 53 only 2 years ago). David Bourn-Fernley (an ex Vice-Chair) returns to the Board with 16 votes. The immediate past Chair Carol Cotterill gained 15 votes (down in 2 years from 33), the Davidsons (mother and son) joined the Board for the first time with 14 and 15 votes. Valerie Stone-Lucas (immediate past director) gained 12 votes (down from 18, 2 years ago). The decline in membership from about 90 to 70 only partly explains the lower AGM attendance and votes.

The VAO reps declared that Valerie had not been elected. Candidates need 51% to succeed. The number of NO's was not given. At least 12 must have voted against Val – which we are expected to accept on trust (just as in some dodgy states elsewhere!).

Transparency surely requires that

(a) the number of proxy votes be declared prior to the vote

(b) that the number of ballot papers issued is declared

(c) that yes <u>and</u> no votes are shown – which will also show the number of abstentions by calculation.

The present voting process needs improvement at the very least.
