Stronsay Recycling Centre – Plastic Announcement



The Waste Team at the Stronsay Recycling Centre have been working with OIC and Stronsay Community Council and are excited to announce that Stronsay will soon have a Plastic Recycling Skip as part of a 12-month Trial which, with community support could become permanent.

This Skip will take most Household Bottles such as washing up liquid, drinks, shampoo, conditioner and milk bottles.

To make this trial a success we need your help in following some clear instructions when using the skip.

- Please make sure your bottles are empty No liquids
- 2. Please make sure your bottles are rinsed
- 3. Please remove their tops and put those in the normal rubbish
- 4. There must be a number 1 or 2 on the bottom (HDPE or PET can be recycled)



The Skip will be located behind the current glass, metal, paper skip next to Ebenezer Stores.

The Waste team located at the Recycling Centre at Woods yard will be available for any questions or to offer any assistance from the 1st December

### STEPHEN CLACKSON'S LETTER FROM SCHOOL PLACE

Reporting on the work of your councillor in Orkney and beyond

Councillors and island community council transport reps attended workshops held by the consultants preparing OIC's outline business case to present to the Scottish Government on improving our inter-island transport. This covers both the air and ferry services and how together they can be brought up to the Scottish Government's own standards for transport connectivity. I have requested that a ro-ro ferry service to North Ronaldsay be included in the business case, as reliance on a lo-lo service is unprecedented anywhere else in Scotland.

Orkney College student residences have been exercising me this month. At the Orkney College Quality Working Group meeting, I requested that provision of student accommodation be included as an area of development in the *Orkney College UHI Evaluative Report & Enhancement Plan* before it is submitted to Education Scotland. This clearly falls under the quality indicator "wellbeing, equality and inclusion" where it concerns students from the outer North Isles, who cannot easily travel back and forth daily to attend courses. Unfortunately, ferry disruption due to bad weather led me to miss the workshop on student accommodation, but I e-mailed in my views, which are that affordable student residences in Kirkwall (within reasonable walking/cycling distance of the College, the Institute of Northern Studies, the town centre and the harbour) are needed to jointly serve:

- 1) Students from the Isles (ineligible to stay at the Papdale Halls) undertaking both FE and HE courses at Orkney College, and also apprentices from the Isles;
- 2) Students from outwith Orkney, primarily undergraduates and postgraduates, studying at Orkney College.

I learnt at the UHI Foundation meeting I attended as OIC's rep that the UHI has funded student residences at Inverness College (150 rooms), in Elgin for Moray College (40 rooms), and in Dornoch for North Highland College (40 rooms).

At the Orkney College Management Council meeting, my proposal that our two student reps be given full voting rights was supported, but because the College Management Council is a sub-committee of OIC, this still faces the hurdle of being passed at the next Policy & Resources Committee meeting.

Other meetings I have attended include: members' sessions, part of the Community Council Conference, a seminar on the *National Improvement Framework Improvement Plan*, a meeting of the Education, Leisure & Housing Committee, a North Isles ward meeting with the Executive Director of Development & Infrastructure, and (in Inverness) a meeting of the Highlands & Islands Science Skills Academy Leadership Board.

We have now begun the difficult budget challenge process to see how we can match the Council's spending to its income and resources—a balanced budget being a legal obligation. Our income depends to a great extent on what Government Scotland is willing to give us. Will it, for example, again provide the crucial additional funding to support our inter-island ferries? As for any cuts, I am determined that nobody will be able to accuse OIC of being punitive, mean-spirited and callous (accusations levelled this month by the United Nations Special Rapporteur on Extreme Poverty & Human Rights at the UK Government's austerity policy and its attitude to the most vulnerable in our society).

And so, with Christmas coming, I join with Tiny Tim (not the American falsetto singer and ukulele player) in saying: "God bless Us, Every One!"

### 5GRuralFirst: 5G Broadcast Radio Trial, Stronsay

Representatives from the BBC, CloudNet and OIC recently met with members of Stronsay Community Council, and from a presentation given on the proposed 5G Broadcast Radio Trial to be conducted on Stronsay, the following information has been copied and outlines the reason for the trial and its proposal:

### Introduction

5GRuralFirst is a UK Government-funded project to explore the benefits of the latest generation of mobile technology (5G) for rural communities and industries such as agriculture, broadcasting and utilities.

As part of the project, BBC Research & Development is working to trial the transmission of BBC radio stations over 5G. Fewer and fewer mobile phones have FM radios in them and so we're looking to see whether broadcasting over 5G could be a viable way to receive BBC radio on portable devices in the future.

We plan to use the technology to transmit twelve radio stations, including BBC Radio Orkney and have twenty smartphones available for members of the public to try the technology out and test it for us. As well as reception of radio stations, normal mobile Internet access will also be available.

### Proposal

The proposal is for Stronsay Junior High School to host the mobile base station infrastructure and equipment needed to make the radio trial work and bring 4G/5G coverage to the island.

Practically, this would involve hosting a typically 10 metre high mast, with antennas mounted on it (including 2 which are around one metre tall) plus space to host equipment inside a building or nearby cabinet and supplied by mains electricity. Safeguards will be put in place to ensure that members of the public (including school staff and pupils) are not able to get closer to the antennas than public safety transmission limits allow.

As part of the trial, the Wireless ISP CloudNet would also bring coverage to Stronsay for the first time.

We have twenty smartphones available for the project and we're looking to recruit triallists on the island to test the reception of BBC radio services for us as well as to submit coverage reports. Our thinking was that the school community could be an additional potential source of help with recruiting members of the public to help us test the system.

Stronsay Junior High School is an ideal location from our perspective to host equipment and help us with the trial due to, not only its strong links into the community, but also its geography—situated as it is at the centre of the island and at its highest point. We also intend to explore educational opportunities around the trial.
