MONTHLY REPORT TO THE COMMUNITY **FROM TONY WITHERS LDO.**

Hello All,

It has been a busy month for the Trust what with the AGM and much work being done on the Turbine project.

To date Julia and I have been flitting back and forth to Kirkwall attending several meetings with our fellow island 'Turbineers' to iron out the way forward as regards tenders for project management , construction , bank finance and due diligence that are required to be put into place prior to the actual site work starting. A huge amount of work is involved in a +£1.5 million pound project and our job is to ensure we have the right technical, legal and financial support in place . Next month in my jottings I will set out a rough timescale of events up to the blades turning for your information.

With reference to the Enterprise Zone the Architect has made a site inspection and we are looking forward to receiving outline plans that we will share with you at a public meeting as soon as we can.

The Mother and Toddler group have approached me to find funding to replace worn out equipment and a day trip. With their input we will jointly put a strong case together to secure said funding.

Some concern has been expressed with regard to the new Fast Ferry service. I have asked for a quote from the Project Leaders, Eday Partnership and this is their response. Clive Brooks, Chair of Eday Trust, said :

“The long awaited and much anticipated North Isles Fast Ferry is due to take her berth in Stronsay harbour shortly, Celtic Voyager is a custom built 11 metre passenger cabin Rib. She is licensed to carry 12 passengers and two crew, fitted with all the necessary safety equipment and is MCA Coded Category 3, which means she is considered totally safe and reliable for service up to 20 miles from a safe haven and is fit for night passage.

She is powered by twin 300 horse power Suzuki engines and has a cruising speed of 25 knots with a top speed of 40 knots, she is also fitted with two of everything that is required for navigation, VHF radios etc., and of course a life raft and life jackets are supplied to all passengers on boarding.

Celtic Voyager will be paying courtesy visits to the three North Isles she will be serving on Saturday June 5th and will be in the harbour from 9.00am until 11.00am for you to come along and have a look over her, time permitting, there may be the opportunity to take a short trip on her.

This service is designed to complement the Orkney Ferries service which is an essential lifeline service and excellent as it allows little opportunity for inter isles travel for both locals and visitors alike, it will be a Summer only service, there is a published timetable (insert in the Orcadian, May 27th.) but this may be subject to change, as this is a pilot project and demand may dictate some alterations. Booking your ticket is advisable, and you can do this by ‘phoning 616339, we are also going to have an ‘update’ service on Twitter so that people can be informed of any extra sailings or special offers etc. at short notice.

The vessel will also be available for charter, both community (discounted) and commercial and it is hoped to be able to offer further discounts for community use from any profits made on the commercial business.

So in a nutshell, it’s a service for the North Isles communities, run by the community with the aim of improving the social and economic activity between the isles, safe and reliable,...and oh! Yes, quite fast.”

Thanks to Clive for his response and I hope we will all support this pilot project and see it becomes a permanent summer fixture. Below is a photo of the vessel the service will be using.

HORTICULTURE TRAINING DAY

As part of the funding for the Green Island Project there are also various training workshops and events planned. Any of these events will be free of charge and are of course open to anyone to benefit from. The first of these were held on the 12th of May in the Community Hall. There was a great turnout of 18 attendees who were all keen to expand their knowledge in the horticultural field.

The tutors had both travelled from the Aberdeen shire area and arrived on the morning of the 12th with thankfully no travel disruptions. Dr. Audrey Litterick a former horticultural lecturer at Scottish Agricultural College now works as an environmental consultant with EarthCare. The second tutor Norman Stephen is a Scottish Agricultural College soil scientist and a tutor of SAC distance learning courses in organic farming.

After a morning of intense learning about crop choice and soil assessment the students headed out for a more practical exercise. Nigel Durrant had very kindly agreed to host a visit and his garden was soon invaded by visitors (See picture below).

Some time was spent assessing different soil types and identifying the soil present sometimes using Normans rather un lady like method of soil assessment.

Lower Millfield returned to its peaceful state after all had left heading for the greenhouse site by the Kirk. A very useful visit indeed with the discovery of very good soil. Norman Stephen provided the first hole dug at the site which can be seen on the picture below.



After a lovely lunch with Jenny Stones home baked rolls and soup the afternoon was rather intense. Subjects covered were from crop nutrition to crop rotation.

A good day was had by all and the weary students went home clutching their course material with hopefully much new knowledge gained.

A follow up workshop of more practical nature will be held in July once the greenhouse is up. Again anyone will be more than welcome to attend and more details will be available nearer the time.

BOILER SCRAPPAGE SCHEME

As mentioned in previous Limpet. Further information now received from the Energy Savings Trust. The boiler scrappage scheme goes live on the 24th May. The main points are:

- Scheme starts Monday the 24th of May
- £400 voucher available for replacing G rated boilers only to A rated energy rated boilers
- Electric boilers and immersions don't qualify
- Only 5000 vouchers available in this round of funding
- First come first served basis
- Customers can apply online or via the free phone number 0800 512 012
- Customers need to get a quote for a new boiler before the voucher can be issued
- Work cannot start on the boiler replacement until the customer gets confirmation of the voucher
- Vouchers are valid for 12 weeks from date of issue
- Customers need to pay up front and payment will be made by EST with-in 25 days of receipt of the installer invoice and voucher
- As EST don't have an installer accredited scheme for boilers, customers just need to use an installer who is registered with Gas Safe, OFTEC, CLE etc

There have been around 800 calls regarding the scheme already in the Highlands and islands area, so if anyone is interested tell them to do it sooner rather than later.



Stronsay Development Trust is one of four community groups (Stronsay, Shapinsay, Rousay, Egilsay & Wyre, and Hoy) each seeking to appoint part time Turbine Development Officers to support them during the construction and installation phases of their 900KW revenue generating wind turbine projects. It is expected that these posts will be fixed term for a period of 2 years.

In addition to these posts, the groups are engaging a joint project management contractor to be responsible for planning and co-ordinating the installation of these 4 sites, plus one on Eday. The successful applicant for this post will work with the local trust board and joint Project Management contractor to ensure timely and cost effective delivery of this project.

Duties will include:

- To provide key point of contact and communication between the Trust, trading subsidiary, the Project management contractor and third party contractors and stakeholders.
- To develop working relationships with volunteers and other employees and to liaise specifically with the joint Project Management contractor; providing a local resource on the ground to help undertake and coordinate the installation and commissioning of the site.
- To be available to liaise with contractors working on the island
- To draft monthly progress reports for local groups and funders.
- To attend training as required

Ideally applicants will have a good understanding of relevant construction projects, and an interest in renewable technology and/or community sustainability and development is desirable. You should be computer literate, with good communication, organisational and team working skill along with the ability to work to deadlines and with minimum supervision.
