UPDATE

The office and business units at the site of the old Lobster Ponds are beginning to take shape, with completion envisaged by the end of the summer. It has been suggested that the units are named 'The Lobster Pots', to reflect the history of the original building.

COMMUNITY UPDATE

APRIL 2015

Stronsay Renewable Energy Limited (the Development Trust's turbine company) has some news items they'd like to share with the community:

- After being out of commission (due to lightning strike in December), the community wind turbine is now up and running again.
 - During the past week (13-20 April) it generated 48 mega watts.
 - While the first responsibility must be to pay down loans, it is hoped that funding for community projects can be available again soon.
- There have been some changes at board level for the turbine company (SREL):
 - Interim directors are Julie Andrews, Chris Evans, Robin Graham, and Val Lucas. They are all serving on a voluntary basis and only until a new, permanent board can be elected.
 - Diane Elliott has been contracted to serve as Financial Manager.
 - Adrian Miller and Steve Weaver have continued to offer their assistance with turbine maintenance, for which the Board is very grateful.
- SREL will be looking for new voluntary board members who would be interested in working together to ensure that the turbine continues to run and generate funds to be used for the good of the community.

Stronsay Renewable Energy Limited is committed to keeping the island informed of the progress of one of Stronsay's important community assets.

LETTER FROM SCHOOL PLACE

As reported in the international weekly journal of science, *Nature*, geneticists from the universities of London and Oxford have proved what most of us suspected all along, that Westray folk really are a race apart!

On Lady Day you may have heard OIC's historic first efforts at audio-casting, which began being broadcast part-way through the Education, Leisure & Housing Committee meeting. Riveting stuff! Parents will have been pleased to hear that the price of school meals will not be going up this year, and those with children in the Papdale Halls will have been reassured by the significantly improved Care Inspectorate inspection report that the residence received this year compared to last.

Likewise, the Development & Infrastructure Committee meeting was also audiocast. I am not a member of this committee, but I was invited to be in attendance for the item on the North Isles Landscape Partnership Scheme. Details of the scheme can be found, along with links to the consultation responses from each island, on the Council's website at:

I drew the committee's attention to the cited key project idea "promotion of the isles as places to live" and asked whether there were examples from the existing Scapa Flow Landscape Partnership Scheme of projects that led to new sustainable employment opportunities. I was told that there were examples.

Following up on the air ambulance meetings I attended in Stronsay in June last year, I joined Liam McArthur MSP in Sanday for meetings with Head of Air Ambulance Service, Andy Moir. Andy gave us a reassuring message on forthcoming improvements in the service, and it is clear that the Scottish Ambulance Service is now taking the needs of Orkney's North Isles seriously.

The agendas of the Policy & Resources Committee meetings are always frighteningly weighty. This time we had 653 pages of reports and appendices weighing nearly 4 lb! The item which was of most interest to the public, but probably of least relevance to the North Isles, was the one on the Kirkwall Placemaking Proposals. I requested that should any money remain unspent when the people of Kirkwall reject the Broad Street proposal, may it please be diverted to us in the Isles, where there are many settlements that could benefit from "placemaking" funding. In the next item on the agenda we were informed of the estimated costs of the repair and maintenance programme for piers and harbours. For the North Isles these come to: £5,000 for Shapinsay, £10,000 each for Eday and North Ronaldsay, £20,000 each for Rousay and Stronsay, and £25,000 for Sanday.

Other meetings I have attended this month include: a Special General Meeting on Health & Social Care Integration, a Governance Review, a presentation on the Orkney Research Campus, Change Programme Board, Stronsay Parent Council's AGM, and I sat on the interview panel for an education post.

THREE YEARS ENJOYING WILD ORKNEY

Two **Orkney Nature Festivals** and a **mini autumn festival** attracted over 2,000 participants in total, bringing together organisations, businesses and community groups around the county and strengthening Orkney's reputation as a world-class wildlifewatching destination.

An **innovative events programme** led by the **Enjoy Wild Orkney ranger** explored new ways of engaging visitors with wildlife and promoted areas of Orkney that first-time visitors often miss, such as Flotta and the north isles, including remote islands such as Auskerry.

Support for the pioneering **Sanday sealcam** helped the Sanday Ranger bring grey seal pups to 100,000 people around the world, while **new experimental webcams** captured footage of redthroated divers, the rarely-seen grey seal pupping beach on RSPB Scotland Copinsay and wildfowl at RSPB Scotland Mill Dam on Shapinsay.

The free **Discover Wild Orkney app**, launching spring 2015, is a downloadable guide to many of Orkney's best wildlife-watching spots, featuring an offline map, GPS locator, and information on over 70 species of birds, mammals, insects and plants which Orkney is known for.

Visitors can now pick up a free **booklet** with information on RSPB Scotland's 13 nature reserves in Orkney. **Brown signs** make the Mainland reserves much easier to find, while new **welcome panels** and on-site **trail guides** help visitors get the most out of their visit.

The **Enjoy Wild Orkney field teacher** has enthused children around the county about their natural heritage through 63 free sessions at schools, libraries and nature reserves, ranging from storytelling to art projects, with additional wildlife adult education activities from the **community engagement officer** and **project officer**.

Many of Orkney's species are declining at an alarming rate, from curlews to great yellow bumblebees, due to intensified farming practices, the drainage of wetlands and other changes in land use. **Direct habitat improvements** like the creation of a pond at Happy Valley and new pools at RSPB Scotland The Loons have helped keep space for nature in our landscape.

The new **Eddie Balfour hen harrier hide** at RSPB Scotland Cottascarth, opening 21 April 2015, offers fantastic views of moorland wildlife. The naming of the hide honours Orcadian Eddie Balfour, who began one of the longest-running raptor studies in the world on Cottascarth's hen harriers.

- The RSPB Scotland **Birsay Moors hide**, opening spring 2015, offers brilliant views of the rare and sensitive red-throated divers that nest here on a secluded lochan, next to Burgar Hill, Evie.
- The **Listening Wall** at RSPB Scotland The Loons was inspired the concrete listening walls on the south coast of England, part of Britain's early warning system at the start of WWII. The parabolic wall concentrates the symphony of waders and wildfowl, a magical aural experience.
- Stunning **wildlife videos** by award-winning film-makers Raymond Besant and Mark Jenkins capture the natural highlights of spring, summer, autumn and winter in Orkney, inspiring visitors and residents alike to make the most of the experiences Orkney has to offer.


