Despite all the problems along the way this valuable project has at last been completed. The end of grant report was submitted to David Knight, the Trust's funding officer at Big Lottery, and the Chair received following reply, to quote:

"Thank you for your end of grant report and photographs of the completed building. Your report completes the monitoring requirements of the grant which will now be closed. I would take this opportunity to acknowledge all the time, effort and dedication you and the Board have given to bring all the projects to this stage and to congratulate you all on your significant achievement.

It has been a pleasure to manage this grant and I am pleased that I was able to visit Stronsay to see your beautiful island at first hand"

The Trust is intending that the office and meeting room will soon be available to the community and visitors as a "hot office" facility, with wi-fi and Skype connection. Of the two business units, one is providing a sorting office for Stronsay Post Office and it is hoped that the other will become a recycling centre for the island should the Trust's pending application to the Climate Challenge Fund be successful. Two units have been set aside for a Heritage Centre for Stronsay, with funding for their completion and fitting out for display purposes being included in OIC's North Isles Landscape Partnership Scheme application to the Heritage Lottery.

### **A RARE ORCHID FOUND ON STRONSAY**

In June a group of Stonsay residents including myself joined the Orkney Field club on a walk from Kirbuster to Housebay. During the walk an unusual Orchid was spotted and photographed. John Crossley who is plant recorder in Orkney got in touch with an Orchids specialist at Kew Gardens. This is what John said after receiving the reply.

"It was a hybrid between Early Marsh Orchid *Dactylorhiza incarnata* and Northern Marsh Orchid *D. purpurella*. There is only one previous record of this hybrid from Orkney (also from Stronsay). It is said to occur where the two species grow together but there are only about 100 previous records in British Isles. However, here's the even better bit: the Northern Marsh Orchid parent was a variety with spotted leaves (see photo), called *var. cambrensis*, which has been recorded only about 50 times in BI (although actually I think it may be quite frequent in Orkney), and this may be the first time that this particular version of the hybrid has been identified (hard to tell - it does not have a name)."

### **RECENT BIRD SIGHTINGS.**

September began with an enormous ornithological 'bang' when a Great Shearwater was seen flying past Bomasty Bay – close enough for all the features to be noted of a species which breeds in the Southern Hemisphere. The bird gave me just ten seconds-worth of perfect side-on views as it flapped and glided past, until it went out of sight behind the Osen. It was interesting to note later, that one had been seen off North Ronaldsay the same day. Another new species for the island – and as usual, totally unexpected!

A party of Black-tailed Godwit built up on the Bu Loch during the month, from just a few to over 50 by mid-month, but all had departed by the 20th. A mixture of small migrants were seen in the first week including a few (early) Robins and Willow Warblers, a Garden Warbler, and a few House Martins. There was a big influx of Wigeon around 15th -20th with over 600 on the Bu Loch and others elsewhere – a welcome return to the numbers seen pre the Grey-lag Geese invasion. There has been a similar welcome return of Curlew and Golden Plover, both of which have shown a big increase again this year after last years small increase. 4 Whooper Swans were among the Wigeon at the Bu for three days mid-month and are now hopefully residing on the Lea Shun loch where 120 birds formerly over-wintered annually.

The second half of the month saw an increase in Pied Wagtail and Wheatear numbers, the latter heading south from the breeding-grounds in Greenland (and perhaps Iceland). In what has been a very quiet spell for small migrants two new species for the Autumn were discovered in the garden at Dale – a Goldcrest on 20th and a Lesser Redpoll on 21st. A male Blackcap at Holin Cottage appeared to be the only new small migrant to arrive on the island on 22nd. Merlin, Kestrel and at least 3 different Hen Harriers have been seen in the last few days.

There has been an inexplicable increase in Rock Pipits this year and the birds can be observed striding about the tarmac at close range in the Village Street – mainly between the Hotel and the Village Shop. They are quite dark in colouration and run about rather like wagtails.

PS As per usual there was another exciting find after typing the above – albeit rather brief – an Arctic Warbler in the garden at Slap!

#### This Month's Featured Area - the Kirk and The Manse.

The walled area around The Kirk and The Manse may be small, but the mixed habitat – from the gravelled Car Park and areas of neatly mown grass surrounding the former, to the garden with its trees and hedges – has attracted some amazing birds to the area.

And we have been very lucky! All the resident Ministers in The Manse during our time here have been interested in wild-life and alerted us to many of the best birds discovered there – a Red-footed Falcon on the washing-line post, a Rosy Starling on the window -sill, and a Long-eared Owl roosting on a high wall near the back door. A Rosefinch was discovered by a visitor attending a wedding some years ago and many birdwatchers have been startled by Woodcock clattering out of the undergrowth in late Autumn.

Many species of warbler have been seen in the garden including Icterine, Barred, and the extremely rare Dusky Warbler, and a Red-breasted Flycatcher spent a couple of days in the garden in autumn 2013. Pride of place must however go to the 3 Bee-eaters which spent several days on the island in early Summer 2015 delighting passers-by and visitors to the Community Greenhouse from where the best views could be had. The birds regularly hawked for insects around the Kirk building.

But it is not just the garden which attracts birds – the gravelled car-parking area in front of the Kirk has also attracted a number of species including Ortolan Bunting in 1993 and several Arctic Redpolls during the big invasion in 1995. Ringed Plover occasionally visit the car park – perfect habitat for the species – and a pair Oystercatchers prospected the area for some time in Spring several years ago.

### **STEPHEN CLACKSON'S LETTER FROM SCHOOL PLACE**

This month has seen the start, through a series of seminars, of our having to confront the tough decisions we are going to have to make in order to set this year's council budget. At this stage, we are still exploring and debating options. Nothing has been decided yet, but, inevitably, given the significant reduction in funding for local authorities from Government Scotland, we are going to be forced to make significant cuts.

We held our first meeting of the Orkney College Management Council since the election, and I have been away to a meeting of the Highlands & Islands Science Skills Academy Leadership Board (as the OIC representative) where I was able to resume the work started during my initial appointment in the last council.

I also attended my first meeting (again, as the OIC representative) of the Dounreay Stakeholder Group (DSG). The DSG is an independent body tasked with providing public oversight and scrutiny of the Dounreay site, where the nuclear reactors there have been undergoing decommissioning for a number of years. Immediately adjacent to the Dounreay site is the Vulcan Naval Reactor Test Establishment, which is also being decommissioned. It, too, falls within the remit of the DSG. The Group has a website at: http://www.dounreaystakeholdergroup.org/ . Representation on the DSG is important to Orkney because the facility lies just across the Pentland Firth from us.

Other meetings I have been involved in this month include: a members' briefing session with Alistair Carmichael MP; Zurich Insurance training on health & safety; a meeting of the Orkney Health & Care Committee; a seminar on the expansion of early learning and childcare (as required by Government Scotland)—our plan for which being then discussed at the subsequent Education, Leisure & Housing Committee meeting; a political session for members; a strategic projects briefing; a meeting of the Orkney Ferries Board; a meeting of the Orkney & Shetland Valuation Joint Board, and a workshop on the *Islands (Scotland) Bill*.

Out in the Isles, I went along to a meeting of the Stronsay School Parent Council.

Owing to a lack of interest by folk in standing for our community councils (in some areas not enough candidates standing to even meet the minimum required to form a community council let alone trigger an election!), the deadline was extended to the 18<sup>th</sup> September. Ballot papers for those areas where an election is being contested **must be returned by 5pm on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October**. Even if you did not feel able to stand, do make sure you vote. If you are 16 or 17, this will be the first time you'll have been able to vote in any election, so exercise your right to do so. Community Councils play an important role in local democracy by representing local views which can influence OIC decisions in planning and the provision of local services, and they provide an effective, strong voice within each community area offering sound, local advice on a range of community issues.

### WEEKEND AIRPLANE SERVICE PUBLIC CONSULTATION

Community views are sought on a suggestion that has been made regarding a change to the Saturday and Sunday inter-isles airplane service.

It has been suggested the Saturday 1030 flight from North Ronaldsay be combined with the 0930 Sanday and Stronsay flight rather than Sunday afternoon.

The major advantage would be on Sundays. Sanday and Stronsay would have a dedicated flight which could be run in the morning, enabling a day return using the evening ferry and allowing onward connectivity, which neither the ferry or the current air schedule allow.

If the Saturday morning North Ronaldsay/Sanday/Stronsay flight did happen to be overbooked, Stronsay travellers would have the option of a Saturday morning ferry service.

Stronsay Community Council is of the view the suggested change is a good move. Stronsay would keep the Sunday flight, which took so long to achieve, and have it at what could be considered a much more beneficial time.



### **HOME FIRE SAFETY VISITS**

The Scottish Fire and Rescue Service is once again offering free Home Fire Safety Advice visits, the logic being that it is much better to prevent a fire in the first place than to have to come to put one out! Members of Stronsay Fire and Rescue Service hope by these visits to help raise your awareness of fire safety and to help make your home a safer place in which to live. During the visit we would attempt to identify any potential fire hazards, check that you have enough smoke detectors and that they are correctly sited, and give advice on fire safety and what to do in the event of having a fire. We will also check that your smoke detectors are working correctly and supply and fit new ones free of charge if you need them. If you've had a visit from us before but feel you would benefit from a return visit to check over your home, see what can be done to make your home a safer place and refresh your memory on what to do in the event of a fire then we would also be happy to come along. This visit would be carried out by two members of the local Fire and Rescue Service at your convenience. Please be assured that the visit will be completely confidential and that we would only check areas of your home where you are happy for us to go!

### **FIREFIGHTERS NEEDED!**

We have had a good response to our campaign to recruit more firefighters on Stronsay but there are still vacancies to be filled! Are there still lads or lasses out there who would like a challenge and want to do something worthwhile in the community?

Do you want to have a challenging role doing something different? Do you want to learn new skills that can be used in a variety of jobs?

Our Retained Duty Firefighters come from diverse backgrounds and bring a variety of experiences to the role. A range of skills are required including being a team player, excellent communication skills and attention to detail.

You must be aged 18 years or over, have a good level of physical fitness, have the required standard of vision and colour perception. You will be required to be readily available to attend incidents and be committed to attending weekly training on Stronsay as well as courses in Kirkwall or further afield as required.

RDS Firefighters are called upon to attend the same wide range of emergency service as wholetime Firefighters, including fires, floods, road traffic accidents, chemical spills and more. They can also be called upon to work with wholetime firelighters to promote fire safety messages, giving fire safety advice to schools and other organisations as well as carrying out free home fire risk assessments within their communities.

In return our RDS Firefighters are paid an annual retainer fee plus additional payments for every incident attended and time spent on all activity including training nights, community engagement and courses.
