FUNERAL OF VILMA ANDERSON (nee MILLER)

The funeral of my late sister, Vilma Anderson, nee Miller took place at Teviot Parish Church, Hawick, Roxburghshire, on 9th January, 2018, Vilma, having passed away after a short illness on 20th December, 2017. After a very well attended service, the interment took place at Wellogate Cemetery, Hawick, where she was laid to rest beside her late husband Jim Anderson.

Vilma was born on 4th September, 1934, at 23, Station, Stronsay, the first of four children born to Johnno and Maggie Miller. She was brought up at Glenmanna, and educated at the Stronsay Junior Secondary School, after which she worked for a time as a maidservant at Sandybank. She then moved into Kirkwall where she worked as a maidservant at Highland Park House until 1953 when she moved to Hawick and worked as a maidservant for a further four years. In 1957, she married Jim Anderson, a local farmer who specialised in breeding Black Faced sheep, in which he was extremely successful. Together they raised four children on Penchrise Farm,- Jimmy, Johnny, Pearl and Catherine.

Vilma was always a keen supporter of the Royal National Lifeboat Institution, her grandfather, Jock Miller, being the mechanic on Stronsay's first lifeboat, the John Ryburn, from 1910 until 1915, and her father Johnno, being a member of the Stronsay lifeboat crew from 1952 until 1972. Her mother Maggie was a founder member of the Stronsay Ladies Lifeboat Guild in which she served for many years.

In view of the strong connections with the Stronsay branch of the RNLI, Vilma's family have decided that the funeral collection should be given to that branch, and it gives me great pleasure to pass on the sum of $\pounds730.00$. A big thank you to all who donated to this worthwhile cause.

RECENT BIRD SIGHTINGS

There were a few interesting sightings in the last week of 2017 - a Long-eared Owl hunting near the South School after dark, caught in the headlights of our car, the Blue Tit in the Castle Garden daily, and the party of Chaffinches in the specially sown 'unharvested crop' area at Dale.

Kath & Norman Kent had a great start to 2018 at Dale when a Waxwing was discovered right outside the kitchen window just before dusk on 2nd Jan. What was almost certainly the same bird was seen briefly next day at Geramount.

The over-wintering Dunnock was still present on the Reserve until last seen on 5th – the first day of an influx of Redwings and Fieldfares in a period of fine weather. At least 100 Redwings were seen, and 30 or 40 Fieldfares, with many others no doubt missed! Both Chaffinch and Dunnock were seen at Linksquoy several times in the first half of January

There has been a welcome increase in the numbers of wintering Duck – particularly on the Bu Loch, where up to 8 Pintail have been seen. The wintering Snow Goose was refound on 12th Jan opposite Boondatoon and has been seen in this area several times by Andrea at Smiddy. It can be very elusive and there have been sightings from several sites elsewhere – particularly around the Meikle Water. Merlin and Hen Harrier have both been seen regularly since the new year – including a lovely adult male (grey wings with black wing-tips) of the latter along the Airy Road on 17th

An early Oystercatcher was seen on 12th January, and there was a sure sign that Spring is not too far away when a party of 30 were found feeding in a grassy field at Sunnyside on 17th. And as I write Nrorman Kent has just e-mailed us to report the first Shelduck sighting of the year at the Matpow Loch – another sure sign that Spring is not far away.

It is only in such isolated situations as Stronsay that individual birds of certain species may be 'monitored' and the over-wintering Blue Tit at castle in 2012-13 was clearly the same individual which occasionally visited Dale (on days when there were no sightings at Castle). This year's bird has also visited Dale – and perhaps Helmsley in Whitehall Village well over a mile away, where one was seen by Sheila on two occasions in mid-January. Is this possible? And Blue Tit 'rare'?................... Yes, on Stronsay it certainly is!

Exploring support services for older people in Stronsay

This poster gives some information about a current research project looking at services to support older people in the non-linked islands of Orkney.

This research project has been developed with the help of the Island Development Trusts, Voluntary Action Orkney, Highlands and Islands Enterprise and Robert Gordon University. The research team will be visiting each island group in the coming months to find out about what you think older people need to help them stay on your island, and to explore your experiences of existing support services for older people. The research team will also be looking for examples of how care is delivered in other island and small communities to identify if there are other models that could be explored in Orkney. A project report will be written in March 2018 and will be discussed with a wide range of stakeholders to identify how improvements to services can be made.

STEPHEN CLACKSON'S LETTER FROM SCHOOL PLACE

It was good to get a rest over Christmas and New Year. I think all of us councillors feel the break has given our batteries a chance to recharge in preparation for the difficult challenges we face in 2018, particularly the budgetary ones.

We had a seminar on this very topic just before the holiday, and other meetings I've attended since my last "Letter" include a members' forum, a members' political session, the Empowering Communities Steering Group, and Orkney Ferries Board.

A big question mark still hovers over the Council's request to the Scottish Government for ferry funding, the outcome of which will have an impact on the money available to us for running all of our council services. Below is my reply to the Scottish Government Minister for Transport & the Islands, Humza Yousaf, which I mentioned in my last "Letter".

Dear Humza,

Why are we being excluded from the fairer Scotland?

Thank you for your reply to me dated 29th November, in which you studiously avoided addressing my question about where, exactly, my ward constituents and I fit into the Scottish Government's "fairer Scotland".

To be clear about where my council ward is: it comprises all the Orkney Islands to the north of the Orkney Mainland, thirteen of which are inhabited (and not one of which is linked by a road).

I believe we need to revise the notion that the islands in my ward are served by an "internal" ferry service, somehow separate from the rest of the Scottish network. The Orkney Ferries routes are the first and last lifeline links in a chain of vital transport connexions. The services between Kirkwall and Sanday, Tingwall and Rousay, or Pierowall and Papay are no more "internal" than the services between Barra and Eriskay, Eigg and Muck, or Mull and Iona, all of which enjoy Scottish Government financial support denied to the islands of my ward.

Our ferry crews are not part of the Scottish Government's "fairer Scotland", either. You will be aware that RMT members at Orkney Ferries have balloted for industrial action. The fragile communities of my ward will suffer from such action, but I fear this will have little impact on the political games being played out at Holyrood.

Following my first letter, I had hoped you would have reconsidered your responsibilities and striven to get OIC's request for ferry funding into the draft budget. As *Minister for Transport and the Islands* you are responsible for <u>all</u> Scottish islands, not only those in areas that have elected members of your own political party.

Meanwhile, I am left, along with the other five Orkney councillors representing wards with islands, in the impossible position of expecting colleagues to support drastic cuts in all of Orkney's council services in order to cover the cost of merely maintaining the (as measured by the Scottish Government's own routes & services methodology) less-than-adequate lifeline transport provision our ward constituents are totally reliant upon.

In your ministerial role, what urgent action will you take to rectify this discriminatory situation, the perpetuation of which, In a civilised, democratic society, is utterly unacceptable behaviour for a party in government?

It would appear that Humza is still on *his* break, because I have yet to receive a response from him. On the other hand, I heard from our MSP, Liam McArthur and MP, Alistair Carmichael (to both of whom I had sent copies) within a few days.

If you have access to the Internet, the link https://www.theyworkforyou.com/sp/? id=2017-12-06.12.0 will take you to a transcript of the *Ferry Services (Fares and Funding)* debate moved by Liam McArthur on the 6th December 2017. It makes very interesting reading and shows the breadth of support for our cause in the Scottish Parliament. The "double act", reprimanded by the Deputy Presiding Minister, was Humza Yousaf and Derek Mackay (Scottish Cabinet Secretary for Finance & the Constitution), who were clowning around while Jamie Halcro Johnston was speaking. Such antics make me seriously question the calibre of these two government front-bench politicians, who currently wield so much power over the lives and livelihoods of all of us in the North Isles. In fact, I question whether either of them is fit for purpose!

One of the get-outs from funding our ferries the Scottish Government is consistently deploying is the idea that our inter-island ferries are "internal", somehow separate from the rest of the Scottish ferry network. In my letter above, I suggested we need to revise this notion: "The Orkney Ferries routes are the first and last lifeline links in a chain of vital transport connexions. The services between Kirkwall and Sanday, Tingwall and Rousay, or Pierowall and Papay are no more "internal" than the services between Barra and Eriskay, Eigg and Muck, or Mull and Iona, all of which enjoy Scottish Government financial support denied to the islands of my ward."

As those most directly affected by the ferry funding issue, I urge North Isles residents and island organisations to put additional pressure on the Scottish Government by writing their own letters to Humza Yousaf, Derek Mackay and First Minister Nicola Sturgeon.


