### **BLOW AWAY GARDENING TIPS - APRIL 2012**

The few warm days at the end of March convinced me that we are in for an early spring followed by a long hot summer. I engaged the entirety of my strength and spread the manure that had been lurking for the past 12 months. Sack after sack were spread with great enthusiasm; until I noticed a bouncy black dog came in out out of focus as she ran circuses round the veg plot, eating the manure as fast as she could. No help at all.

Digging in was now an urgent task and I set about this without drawing breath. The job was almost complete but I was forced to stop because of chest pain. This was very inconvenient and since I was on leave I did not have the HeartStart. I abandoned the digging and gradually recovered so it was obviously only cramp.

Before the weather had chance to change I found the numerous packets of seeds and started a mass sowing in all those margarine pots that have been collected in anticipation of this beautiful day. This time the cats did not wreck the seed trays, the dog did not eat the compost and no children accidentally stood in them. They were balanced on cardboard boxes in front of the window and amazingly loads of timid shoots appeared over the next few weeks.

The survivors although becoming long and weedy have been transported to the community greenhouse to take their chances. So far I have been impressed at the number of viable shoots but will keep my eyes trained on them and be prepared for any breakaway groups. The ground outside remains cold and I am not ready to risk checking this with the traditional "sit on a sod" test.

## **STRONSAY'S NATURAL LARDER - PART 2**

We are now well into spring and there are more and more plants poking their heads above the ground. Many of them are edible and surprisingly tasty too.

This month I would like to introduce yet another weed that most will be very familiar with.

### Stinging Nettle - Urtica dioica

This plant has a long history as a medicinal plant and of food source. It is a flowering perennial. It spreads by seed and with their vigorous rhizomes underground. They love rich soil but can grow in poor soils also.

Like so many other plants that are available in spring nettles provide an excellent spring tonic. They are particularly rich in iron and also vitamins A and C.

Wear gloves when picking them as they do give quite nasty stings. Only use the young shoots as they are most palatable.

### Cream of Nettle and Potato soup

Serves 4

- 115 g of butter
- 2 medium sized onions
- 500 g potatoes cut into chunks (soak for a few minutes in cold water to get rid of excess starch)
- 800 ml chicken stock
- 100 g nettle leaves
- Salt and freshly ground pepper, chives, a sprig of fresh thyme and cream to serve.

Melt butter in a large pan and add sliced onions, soften these for 5 mins on a low heat. Add potatoes and chicken stock. Cover and cook for 20 minutes. In the meantime wearing rubber gloves remove the leaves from the stalks wash under cold water. Add to the pan and cook for a further 5 minutes. Ladle into a blender and process until smooth. Return to pan and season well. Serve with chopped chives and a "swirl" of cream!

### Enjoy!

Warning! In order to avoid accidental poisoning eat only plants and mushrooms you can positively identify. Always refer to a field guide.
